You may submit your news in either video or essay form. Depending on your chosen format, you must thoroughly follow the instructions in either the "<u>How to make an IUGS video report</u>" or "<u>How to write an IUGS Young Reporter Essay</u>" instructions document.

All submitted news will be verified by an IUGS panel before being published on our webpage and e-bulletin. The IUGS is dedicated solely to our planet and to a better future for humanity; therefore, we will not accept news that involves:

- Sensitive topics on internal politics of any country
- News containing racial, xenophobic or homophobic comments.
